

**SUBJECT:** Local Transportation Fund – Article 8a Claim



#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2020-55, authorizing the City Manager to file the FY 2020-21 Local Transportation Fund – Article 8a claim in the amount of \$541,581 with San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA).

#### **BACKGROUND**

The California Transportation Development Act (TDA) of 1971 provides a funding mechanism to local government for transit services. This mechanism consists of the collection and allocation of one-fourth cent of each sales tax transaction to the State Local Transportation Fund. Called Local Transportation Funds (LTF), these monies are annually allocated to local governments based on population. In our region, SBCTA is the governing authority over these funds. In FY 2019-20, the total allocation of LTF for the City of Hesperia was approximately \$3,902,051.

LTF may be used for street and road improvements if any monies remain after providing for local transit needs. These road and street monies, should they be available, are designated as LTF – Article 8a funds, and must be officially claimed by the agency as such. This claim must be made to SBCTA.

Annually, the Victor Valley Transit Authority (VVTA) holds public hearings to determine the unmet transit needs. Based upon information from those hearings and established state and federal requirements, VVTA determines the total cost of all transit services in the High Desert. The City contributes LTF to this budget in proportion to its share of participants in the various VVTA programs offered. As a member of the VVTA, the City of Hesperia has met its constituents' FY 2019-20 transit needs through the expenditure of a major portion of allocated LTF.

The City's portion of the VVTA budget for FY 2019-20 was estimated to be \$3,360,470 by SBCTA. The City's monies are allocated to the following areas: VVTA administration and related capital purchases; the interconnected Victor Valley regional route system and related capital purchases; pickup service and transportation for ADA clients; and the Hesperia Community Route.

Distribution of Article 8a funds for FY 2019-20 occurs upon completion of the annual audit of these funds and the Measure I funds. For FY 2018-19, the audit was completed in December 2019.

#### **ISSUES/ANALYSIS**

Since all City transit needs have been met for FY 2019-20 through participation in the VVTA programs cited above, SBCTA has notified the Finance Department that the balance of the City's LTF allocation of \$541,581 can now be claimed as Article 8a monies and used for street and road improvements.

Adoption of the Resolution No. 2020-55 and submission of that Resolution with the required claim form will fulfill SBCTA requirements for the City to claim the residual LTF as Article 8a monies for street and road improvements.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The Article 8a allocation of \$541,581 is included in the FY 2020-21 Budget.

**WHEREAS**, this application must be made to SBCTA on an official LTF – Article 8a claim form, wherein the applying jurisdiction agrees: (1) that such monies will be used only in accordance with TDA provisions and allocation instructions; (2) to provide financial reporting information; and (3) to provide a governing body authorization document to file said claim; and

**WHEREAS**, the City's Finance Department has completed the first two steps of the claim process, and now requests Council authorization to proceed in the collection of these Article 8a monies.

**NOW THEREFORE**, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF HESPERIA CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Council hereby finds that all of the facts set forth in the Resolution are true and correct.

Section 2. The Council authorizes the City Manager to file the FY 2020-21 LTF – Article 8a Local Streets and Roads Claim in the amount of \$541,581 with SBCTA.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Printed items are ordered by City departments on an as-needed basis for business such as printed forms, envelopes, and special mailers. Ordering through a comprehensive agreement allows staff to operate more efficiently by consolidating and reducing time spent obtaining quotes for every printing service purchase.

#### **ISSUES/ANALYSIS**

In 2019, the City executed a one-year agreement with Wirz and Company Printing, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000. Additional funds are necessary to facilitate the continuation of timely and efficient printing service purchases.

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2020-56 amending the Measure I Five Year Capital Improvement Plan for Fiscal Years 2019/20-2023/24 to include revisions made to actual and future project expenditures as well as overall project costs for various projects in the Plan.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Jurisdictions receiving Measure I tax revenue from the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA) Local Street Program must annually adopt, by action of their governing body, a Five Year Measure I Capital Improvement Program (MICIP) which outlines the projects upon which the Measure I pass-through funds will be expended. Only projects identified in the current CIP are eligible for use of Measure I revenue and only 50% of the estimated revenue can be programmed for use on general maintenance and city overhead. The other 50% of revenue should be programmed to specific road projects which identify projects by street name and project type. At the end of each year, SBCTA audits the City's Measure I expenditures to ensure they are consistent with the projects programmed in the MICIP. The Fiscal Year 2019/20-2023/24 MICIP was due to SBCTA by August 30, 2019.

#### **ISSUES/ANALYSIS**

On August 6, 2019, the City adopted and filed the Fiscal Year 2019/20-2023/24 MICIP with SBCTA as expected. The City identified all of its programmed capital improvement projects in the plan; however, actual funds spent for some projects differed from the projected amount listed in the MICIP for FY 2019/20. These projects include the Hesperia Park and Ride Project (CO 6523), the Traffic Signal at Ranchero Road and Maple Avenue (CO 7131), the FY 2018/19 Street Improvement Project (CO 7149), the Aqueduct Crossing Improvements (CO 7096), the Traffic Signal at Ranchero Road and Maple Avenue (CO 7131), the Sultana Street Improvements (CO 7143), the Muscatel Street Improvements (CO 7144), the Traffic Signal at Ranchero Road and Cottonwood Avenue (CO 7146), the Ranchero Road Aqueduct Crossing (CO 7139), Ranchero Road Improvements (CO 7094), and the Traffic Signal at Main Street and Timberlane (CO 7159). (See Attachment 2 for all adjustments).

For the majority of the above mentioned projects, the City spent less than anticipated on each project as no funds, or reduced funds, were expended out of these projects in this fiscal year; those budgeted projections have been moved to Fiscal Year 2019/20 in the amended report. For CO 7139 and CO 7094, more funds were spent in FY 2019/20 than originally anticipated as the

projects progressed. The I Avenue Corridor Enhancement Study (CO 7151) was not originally included in the FY 2019/20-2023/24 MICIP; however, there were expenditures for this project in the amount of \$4,000; therefore, this project has been added to the Amended FY 2019-2024 MICIP report.

All revisions to the FY 2019/20-2023/24 MICIP are included in Attachment 2 to comply with the Measure I Five Year Capital Improvement Plan policies and procedures.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no direct fiscal impact as a result of the subject item. This action simply adopts the Amended Measure I Five Year Capital Improvement Plan 2019/20-2023/24 for the purpose of expending Measure I revenues.

**SUBJECT:** Amendment to Agreement for Audit and Reporting Services for FY 2019-20

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City of Hesperia, Hesperia Housing Authority, Community Development Commission, Hesperia Fire Protection District, and Hesperia Water District Council/Boards/Commissions approve an amendment to the existing Professional Services Agreement with the independent certified public accounting firm White Nelson Diehl Evans LLP, in the amount of \$7,140, for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$110,650, to include additional report preparation services for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2020.

#### **BACKGROUND**

White Nelson Diehl Evans (WNDE) is the City's current auditor and the firm has extensive experience in governmental auditing and a deep familiarity of the City's accounting structure. In June 2020, a Professional Services Agreement was approved for the performance of an audit of the City and the required State reporting for the year ended June 30, 2020.

#### **ISSUES/ANALYSIS**

The current agreement provides for WNDE to perform an audit of the City, as well as the required State reporting and preparation of the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR), with the remaining report preparation for the Water District, Fire Protection District, Housing Authority, and Community Development Commission to be prepared by staff. Due to timing in the departure of a senior staff person in the Finance Department, as well as other workload challenges, an amendment to the existing agreement with WNDE is recommended for these additional reporting services in order to meet all reporting deadlines.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The proposed \$7,140 amendment for additional report preparation services includes: \$2,040 for the Water District, \$2,040 for Fire Protection District, \$1,530 for the Housing Authority, and \$1,530 for the Community Development Commission. A fourth quarter budget amendment will be requested at the end of the 2020-21 fiscal year if budget savings are not otherwise available for the respective funding sources.
