COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS AND COMMENTS

Council Member Swanson commented on remarks made by public commenter Bill Jensen, the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday, attendance at Tri-Agency meeting, the City's Street Adoption program, attendance at the Sultana High School Talent Show, attendance at upcoming MDAQMD training and AQMD meetings.

Council Member Brosowske requested that the following items be considered at a future meeting: City negotiations, information regarding Glendale Crossing at Rock Springs Road, extension of Santa Fe to Hwy 138, the City's traffic plan and homelessness issues within the City.

Council Member Gregg commented on the Glendale Crossing at Rock Springs Road, complimented the work done by City Staff, the Public Safety Advisory Committee, and agreed with addressing homelessness within the City.

Mayor Pro Tem Holland commented on the Sultana High School Talent Show, homelessness within the City, thanked Kelly Gregg for participation on the Public Safety Advisory Committee (PSAC), requested that PSAC meet three times per year and provide requests for agendizing items to the City Manager's Office, commented on the request made by Council Member Brosowske on public labor agreements, and railroad crossings within the City. Mayor Pro Tem Holland requested that decisions made by the City Council Advisory Committee (CCAC) during appeals hearings be advisory and to create an alternate appointment position on advisory committees.

Mayor Bird commented on homelessness within the City, railroad crossings, the City's Youth in Government Day program, Sultana High School Talent Show, attendance at the VVTA meeting, and thanked staff for all their hard work.
